International support

07.07

- Estonia delivered short-range **Mistral surface-to-air missile systems** and missiles to Ukraine. The press service of the Ministry of Defense of Estonia reported this.
- The United Kingdom has announced a **new military aid package** including missiles, AS-90 artillery systems, combat boats and other weapons.

08 – 09.07

- **Ukraine and Poland signed a security agreement.** This document, for the first time among the already signed security agreements, provides for the possibility of intercepting missiles and drones in Ukraine's airspace that are launched toward Poland. Also, for the first time in a security agreement, it refers to the creation of a "Ukrainian Legion." Citizens of Ukraine temporarily living in Poland and other countries will be able to join the legion. Separately, Polish Prime Minister Donald Tusk mentioned that **Poland will consider transferring** at least one **additional MiG-29 squadron** to Ukraine.
- Russia was condemned today by most EU leaders and ministers, as well as the USA, for the **strike on the "Okhmatdyt" children's hospital** in Kyiv. French Ambassador Gaël Weiss visited the hospital and stated that Russia "will have to answer" for the missile strike.
- Germany will accept **Ukrainian children** for treatment after the Russian attack on the "Okhmatdyt" hospital in Kyiv. This was promised by German Minister of Health Karl Lauterbach to his Ukrainian counterpart Viktor Liashko.
- The German government announced a **new military aid package** for Ukraine. It includes ammunition, the previously committed Patriot air defense system, and air surveillance radars.
- In support of the victims of the "Okhmatdyt," there were **rallies** in the USA, Czech Republic, Germany, and Poland.

10.07

- NATO countries will allocate more than **\$7 million to support women** in the Armed Forces of Ukraine. The funds will be used for equipment. Additionally, NATO's countries will send over 10,000 sets of uniforms, shoes, and other necessary items.
- **New Zealand** announced an **aid package** to Ukraine worth **\$9.8 million**. About \$3.6 million will be allocated for military medical needs and the Drone Coalition, and \$6.1 million for humanitarian aid.
- Lithuania allocated €1 million (44.1 million UAH) for the **reconstruction of the "Okhmatdyt,"** wrote Prime Minister Ingrida Šimonytė on X.
- Ukraine signed a **security agreement with Luxembourg**. For 2024, Luxembourg plans to provide military aid amounting to €80 million. The Grand Duchy will develop an IT coalition and contribute to the air defense and artillery coalition.
- **The Netherlands** is allocating **€300 million for F-16 armaments** for Ukraine. This is in addition to the €150 million previously allocated for aircraft outfitting.
- The Italian government has allocated a record **\$1.7 billion in military aid** to Ukraine for 2025. The publication roma.corriere reported on this.

11.07

- Ukraine plans to hold the **second Peace Summit** with the participation of Russia before the presidential elections in the United States, which are to be held in November 2024. Bloomberg reported this. However, Russian Deputy Foreign Minister Mikhail Galuzin stated that Russia would not participate in the Peace Summit.
- Canada will provide Ukraine **with a new military aid package** worth over \$367 million. It was announced by Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau.
- The Minister of Foreign Affairs of Poland, Radosław Sikorski, said that several thousand people applied for **the Ukrainian Legion**, which is being formed on Polish territory. The Polish side will train the volunteers and then transfer the legion under Ukraine's command.

11.07

- The 75th anniversary **NATO summit** concluded in **Washington** (July 9-11) with the participation of 32 alliance members, partner countries, and Ukraine. Here are the main decisions for Ukraine:
 - NATO members announced "the concrete" progress Ukraine has made in reforms. The bloc called **Ukraine's accession** to the alliance "**irreversible.**"
 - NATO members agreed on a plan to aid Ukraine with **€40 billion in 2025** — the bloc took on the commitment. Half of this amount will be covered by the USA, and the other half by allies. The funds will be **used for military assistance**, related orders and goods, as well as training.
 - **A NATO Senior Representative** will be stationed in Ukraine. He will assist in reforms and necessary changes for accession, reporting to Brussels and the new command in Wiesbaden (NSATU), which is being created to coordinate the supply of military equipment to Ukraine and the training of Ukrainian troops.
 - Ukraine will receive **additional air defense systems**: Germany and Romania will provide two Patriot batteries, the Netherlands, along with partners, will provide one, and the USA will provide another. Italy will supply the SAMP-T system. The USA and allies will deliver NASAMS, HAWK, IRIS-T, and Gepard systems in the coming months.
 - **Norway** will send six **F-16 fighters** to Ukraine this year. The first F-16s from **Denmark** and the Netherlands "are already on the way" — they are being prepared for transfer this summer.
 - **The Ukrainian treaty** was signed — it was done by the European Union and 21 other countries (including the USA, Japan, and the United Kingdom). The treaty aims to **coordinate their assistance** to Ukraine in defense and accelerate the fulfillment of obligations prescribed in bilateral security agreements.
- **Denmark** will finance the production of 18 self-propelled "Bohdana" **artillery systems** for the Armed Forces of Ukraine. The Ukrainian army will receive the first howitzers in the coming months.
- **Norway** will allocate \$92.6 million to **support Ukraine's air defense**. This was announced by Prime Minister Jonas Gahr Støre.
- Ukraine signed a **security agreement with Romania**. Bucharest will help **clear mines** in the Black Sea. Romania also confirmed that it will transfer a Patriot system to Ukraine. It will assist the F-16 training center in preparing Ukrainian pilots.
- Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskiy and U.S. President Joe Biden held a meeting in Washington. Biden announced a **new aid package** for Kyiv, but its contents and value are not yet known.
- **Australia** will provide its largest **military aid package** to Ukraine worth **\$250 million**. It will include guided missiles, anti-aircraft missiles, anti-tank weapons, ammunition, and more.
- **The Netherlands** will contribute €20 million to **the Drone Coalition** fund — the money will go towards one million FPV drones. Meanwhile, Sweden is joining the Coalition — it now includes 11 countries.
- **Lithuania** has announced a new **military aid package** that includes electronic warfare systems, ammunition, and drones.
- **The Portuguese** government will allocate **€220 million in military aid** to Ukraine in 2025. This was reported by the official page of the Portuguese government.
- The United States government has announced a **new military aid package** for Ukraine worth **\$225 million**. The tranche includes one battery of the Patriot air defense system, surface-to-air missiles, artillery ammunition, and anti-tank guided missiles.



- In the Kharkiv sector, the enemy continues its offensive. Several combat engagements took place in the areas of Hlyboke, Staritsa, Liptsy, and Vovchansk.
- In the Kupyansk sector, Ukrainian troops repelled all enemy assaults near Synkivka, Stepova Novoselivka, Pishchane, and Berestove.
- In the Liman sector, Russian troops attacked Ukrainian defense forces in the areas of Nevske, Makiivka, Terny, and Torske, as well as in the Serebryansky forest.
- In the Siverskyi sector, Ukrainian defenders repelled Russian assaults near Bilohorivka, Rozdolivka, and Vyyмка.
- In the Kramatorsk sector, the enemy attacked in the areas of Ivanivske, Andriivka, and Chasovyi Yar.
- In the Toretsk sector, the Russians carried out a series of attacks near the settlements of Toretsk, Pivnichne, Zalizne, and New-York in the Donetsk region.
- In the Pokrovsky sector, Ukrainian defenders repelled assaults in the areas of Oleksandropil, Novoselivka Persha, Novooleksandrivka, Progress, Lozuvatske, Sokil, Yasnobrodivka, Vozdvyzhenka, and Karlivka.
- In the Kurakhivka sector, Ukrainian forces repelled attacks near Krasnohorivka, Paraskoviivka, and Kostiantynivka.
- In the Vremivsk sector, the Russians launched a series of assaults on Ukrainian positions near Vodiane, and Urozhayne.
- In the Orikhivsk sector, there were firefights near Mala Tokmachka and Robotyne.
- The situation in the Volyn and Polissya sectors remained unchanged. No signs of the formation of enemy offensive groups were detected.
- On the border with Chernihiv and Sumy regions, Russian troops maintain a military presence and increase the density of minefields along the state border of Ukraine.

07.07	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Ukrainian intelligence officers struck a Russian logistics center in the occupied Donetsk region, the Main Intelligence Directorate of Ukraine said. Intelligence officers attacked a logistics center in Debaltseve, where the Russian army stored tank equipment and ammunition. And in Novoluhanske, they burned down an expensive Russian automated obstacle course station R-330Zh "Zhitel". ➤ General Staff: The situation remains the most intense in the Pokrovsk sector (Donetsk region), where Ukrainian troops repelled 49 attacks by Russian troops. ➤ In the Kharkiv sector, the Russian army continues its offensive. There were 11 combat engagements near Vovchansk, Hlyboke, and Lypky. The number of combat engagements in the Kupiansk sector also increased to seven on the last day, with attacks near Synkivka, Petropavlivka, and Stelmakhivka. At the same time, the Defense Forces struck a Buk anti-aircraft missile system, a drone control center, and 22 military concentration areas. ➤ At night, Ukrainian drones attacked the Voronezh region of the Russian Federation. According to local authorities, they were shot down by air defense, and the wreckage fell on a warehouse. The Russians were storing surface-to-surface and surface-to-air missiles, shells for tanks and artillery, and boxes of ammunition for firearms. ➤ In the Pokrovsk sector, the Ukrainian Defense Forces shot down a Russian Su-25 aircraft, the Khortytsia Joint Task Force reports. The plane was shot down by soldiers of the 110th separate mechanized brigade named after Marko Bezruchko.
08.07	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Over the last day, 141 combat engagements were registered in the frontline. ➤ According to the updated information, over the past day, the enemy launched two missile attacks on the positions of Ukrainian units and populated areas using three missiles, 80 air strikes, involving 111 combat aircraft. In addition, it carried out more than 4,000 attacks, including 110 using multiple-launch rocket systems. ➤ Russia's losses in the war in Ukraine already exceed all of its losses since World War II, The Economist writes, citing the US Department of Defense. From the beginning of the war until mid-June 2024, Russian losses ranged from 462,000 to 728,000 Russian soldiers.
09.07	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Over the last day, 141 combat engagements were registered in the frontline. ➤ According to the updated information, over the past day, in total, the Russians launched six missile attacks on Ukrainian troops' positions and populated areas, using 51 missiles, 62 airstrikes (dropping 84 drones in total), and conducted over 4,000 attacks, 94 of them from multiple launch rocket systems. ➤ Russia reports drone attacks in several regions at once. An oil depot in Kalach-on-Don (the Volgograd region), a substation in Frolovo, and a substation in the Rostov region are on fire. The Russian Defense Ministry claims to have shot down 38 drones overnight in the south and central part of the country.
10.07	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Over the past 24 hours, there were 147 military clashes on the front line. ➤ According to updated information, over the past day, the enemy launched a total of three missile attacks (6 rockets), 61 air strikes (98 combat aircraft), and 1,009 kamikaze drone strikes, and fired 4,366 times at Ukrainian troops' positions and localities, including 98 times from multiple rocket launchers. ➤ The Khortytsia military unit denied the Russian Ministry of Defense's claim that Yasnobrodivka in the Donetsk region had been captured: "As of this morning, the enemy has not had any territorial successes, there is no Russian enemy army in this settlement." However, the enemy is trying to put pressure, and active hostilities are constantly taking place in this area of the frontline.

Military positions

10.07	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Over the past year, the frequency of Ukraine's strikes against the Russian occupiers' fleet in Crimea and the effectiveness of these strikes have increased significantly. The UK Ministry of Defense reported this. According to the British review, according to open-source data, between February 2022 and June 2024, Ukrainian forces damaged or destroyed 26 Russian vessels operating in the Black Sea region.
11.07	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Over the past 24 hours, there were 146 military clashes on the front line. ➤ The Russians are trying to break through to Toretsk, but the Defense Forces are doing everything possible to resist the enemy. This was stated by Nazar Voloshyn, spokesman for the Khortytsia military unit. "Exhausting battles are ongoing at the outskirts of the city, the enemy is actively using aviation and guided aircraft bombs.
12.07	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Over the past 24 hours, there were 120 military clashes on the front line. ➤ According to the updated information, over the past day, the aggressor launched one missile attack (using five missiles) at the positions of Ukrainian troops and populated areas, dropped more than one hundred guided aerial bombs, and fired 4,480 times at the positions of Ukrainian troops and populated areas.
13.07	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Over the past 24 hours, there were 149 military clashes on the front line. ➤ According to the updated information, the enemy carried out 64 air strikes on the positions of Ukrainian units and populated areas yesterday, using 94 combat aircraft. In addition, it carried out almost 5,000 attacks, including 143 from multiple-launch rocket systems. ➤ Russians can attack Ukraine from the north, the threat is absolutely real. This was stated by the head of the Defense Intelligence of Ukraine, Kyrylo Budanov. Budanov noted that the offensive from the north is already underway but did not specify whether it is in Sumy or Chernihiv region so as not to provoke panic. The intelligence chief is convinced that there will be no catastrophe, but the problem cannot be ignored. ➤ "The Russians are preparing new units for attacks in Vovchansk," the Kharkiv Tactical Threat Management Unit said. ➤ Another oil depot is on fire in the Rostov Region of Russia. It was attacked by drones in the morning. The head of the region says the tanks in Tsymliansk are on fire. The Russian Ministry of Defense claims that Ukrainian drones attacked three regions at night - Rostov, Belgorod, and Kursk. A total of four drones were allegedly shot down. The ministry did not report on the consequences of the attack. ➤ The Institute for the Study of War (ISW) writes that Ukrainian troops will continue to defend themselves over the next six months and will not be able to launch a large-scale counter-offensive until 2025. However, ISW's military analysts noted that Ukrainian forces are already trying to seize the tactical initiative by conducting limited counterattacks in certain areas of the frontline. And they will be able to conduct limited counter-offensive operations, even while mostly on the defensive, depending on the flow of Western aid. ➤ Russia has lost a record 70,000 troops over the past 60 days and will potentially lose more than 1,000 every day, according to British intelligence data published by the UK Defense Journal and The Telegraph. The UK Ministry of Defense said in a statement that the huge losses are linked to the Kharkiv front and are likely to continue "as Russia seeks to make gains on the front line in Ukraine": "Average daily Russian casualties (killed and wounded) in Ukraine during May and June 2024 rose to the highest levels of the conflict at 1262 and 1163 respectively."

Attack on the night of July 7

During the night, the Russians launched two "Iskander-M" ballistic missiles and 13 Shahed-131/136 attack drones at Ukraine. Ukrainian air defense shot down all the drones in the Kirovohrad, Kharkiv, Sumy, and Poltava oblasts but did not destroy any missiles.

Attack on the night of July 10

During the night, Ukrainian air defense shot down 14 attack drones over the Odesa, Mykolaiv, Kherson, Dnipropetrovsk, Khmelnytskyi, Cherkasy, Vinnytsia, and Rivne oblasts. At night, the Russians attacked the port infrastructure in the Odesa oblast with missiles. Two people were killed - a security guard and a truck driver. The debris damaged warehouse premises, cargo vehicles, and a civilian ship. Due to the damage to the vessel, there was a liquid spill.

Attack on the night of July 11

At night, air defense shot down six Shahed drones. They were destroyed in the Mykolaiv, Khmelnytskyi, Lviv, and Ivano-Frankivsk oblasts. The Russians also hit the Sumy oblast with two "Iskander-M" ballistic missiles, but they could not be intercepted. The Russians struck the Krolevets community in the Sumy region with "Iskander-M" ballistic missiles. One person was injured.

Attack on the night of July 12

This night, the Russians launched five X-101 cruise missiles, as well as 19 Shahed drones and drones of an unidentified type. Ukrainian air defense destroyed all five X-101 missiles and 11 drones. The main direction of the strike was Starokostiantyniv in the Khmelnytskyi oblast. The missiles were shot down in the Khmelnytskyi, Sumy, and Cherkasy oblasts, and the drones were shot down in the Mykolaiv, Kyiv, Vinnytsia, Khmelnytskyi, Kherson, and Sumy oblasts.

Sumy oblast

July 7: The Russian military carried out 28 shellings in the Sumy region. A total of 88 explosions were recorded. The communities of Khotin, Bilopillia, Krasnopillia, Velyka Pysarivka, Putyvl, Esman, Shalyhine, Druzhba, and Seredyna-Buda were shelled. These communities continued to be shelled throughout the week.

July 8: A critical infrastructure facility was damaged due to shelling in Stetskvka, Sumy region.

July 11: During the night, the Russian army struck the Sumy region with two "Iskander-M" ballistic missiles. One person was injured in Krolevets as a result of the Russian strikes. Two civilians were injured in Seredyna-Buda by FPV drone strikes.

July 12: A fire broke out in the residential sector in the Shostka district due to shelling.

Chernihiv oblast

Throughout the week, the Russians shelled four border communities: Novhorod-Siverskyi, Semenivka, Snovsk, and Horodnia, using mortars, grenade launchers, field artillery, drones, and FPV drones.

Attack on July 8

Air defense shot down 30 out of 38 missiles launched by the Russians over Ukraine in the morning.

Consequences of the missile attack:

- **Kyiv:** 33 people died, including 5 children, and 121 were injured. At the "Okhmatdyt" children's hospital, two adults died under the rubble (one of them was a 30-year-old nephrologist), and 32 people were injured. Eight children were hospitalized with various injuries.
- **Kryvyi Rih:** 10 dead and 47 injured. An industrial enterprise was destroyed.
- **Dnipro:** Residential buildings and an enterprise were damaged. A service station (STO) was also hit. One person died and 19 were injured.
- **Pokrovsk** (Donetsk region): Three people were killed. The Russians hit an enterprise there.

Kharkiv and the oblast

July 7: Two people were injured in Bohuslavka as a result of Russian strikes. At night, a private house caught fire in the Osnovyanskyi district of Kharkiv due to falling debris from a Russian munition, and two women aged 50 and 75 were hospitalized. In Kivsharivka, a police officer was injured by "Uragan" shelling.

July 8: A 62-year-old resident of Lyptsy was injured by a Russian drone strike.

July 10: A woman was killed, and a 70-year-old man was injured due to shelling in Slatyne, Derhachi community.

July 11: Russia struck an agricultural enterprise in Hlushkivka, Kupiansk district, with an aerial bomb. Four men were injured - two aged 43, one aged 44, and one aged 63.

July 12: In Bilyi Kolodiaz, three people were killed, and the number of injured increased to nine due to shelling. Four people were in shock due to a FAB-1500 strike in Borova. Three people were injured by an explosive device in Starytsia, Chuhuiv district. During the day, the Russians shelled Vovchansk with mortars. A 68-year-old woman was injured and hospitalized.

July 13: At least two people were killed and 25 injured due to strikes in Budy, Kharkiv region. The double strike by the Russians hit the railway. Among the injured were a locomotive driver, the station chief, the station duty officer, the senior track master, and a train assembler. Two women, aged 2 and 73, were injured by Russian MLRS shelling in Kupiansk.

Throughout the week, the Russian army struck the areas of Kharkiv, Starytsia, Vovchansk, Lyptsy, Pokalyane, Hlyboke, Mali Prokhody, Kupiansk, Petropavlivka, Kurylivka, Slatyne, Ruski Tyshky, Hlushkivka, and Vovchanski Khutory.

Mykolaiv oblast

July 7: The Russians attacked the villages of Dmytrivka, Solonchaky, and Dniprovskoye in the Kutsurub community with FPV drones. July 8 and the night of July 9: The Russian army attacked all four districts of the region with ballistic and cruise missiles, as well as an FPV drone. In the Bashtanka district, a ballistic missile strike damaged the equipment of an agricultural enterprise and two vehicles. Two men were injured by shrapnel. In the Voznesensk district, a ballistic missile strike on a farm injured a 45-year-old woman and a 5-year-old child. July 10: The Russians launched a missile strike on a civilian facility in Voznesensk, resulting in one death and eight injuries.

Donetsk oblast

Pokrovsk District: Kurakhivska community, Ostrivske, Hostre, Selydove, Myrnograd, Novoselivka Persha of the Ocheretyne community, Kurakhove, Kostyantynopil, Berestky, and Novoekonomichne of the Hrodivka community were shelled. On July 12, four people were killed and ten injured in Mymohrad. Houses, administrative buildings, power lines, and garden houses were damaged.

Kramatorsk District: Lyman, Mykolaivka, Kostiantynivka, Zoria, and Romanivka of the Illinivka community, Sloviansk, Zarichne, Yampil, Torske, and Rayhorodok of the Mykolaivka community were shelled. Houses, cars, administrative buildings, infrastructure facilities, industrial buildings, and household structures were damaged. There were injured and killed.

Bakhmut District: Toretsk, Chasiv Yar, Siversk, Shcherbinivka, Leonidivka, and Serebrianka were shelled. An administrative building, an infrastructure facility, houses, an apartment building, and an industrial building were damaged. There were injured and killed.

Zaporizhzhia oblast

July 7: The Russian army carried out 282 strikes on seven cities and villages in the Zaporizhzhia region within 24 hours. Specifically, the territories of Hulaiipole, Orikhiv, Mala Tokmachka, Novoandriivka, Robotyne, Staroukrainka, Malynivka, and Levadne were shelled 163 times with artillery. These areas were intensively shelled throughout the entire week.

July 8: Three men were injured as a result of Russian attacks on Vasylivka and Zaporizhzhia districts. Four people were injured in an attack on Vilniansk.

July 9: The Russians attacked the village of Bilenke in the Zaporizhzhia region, targeting a social infrastructure facility. One man was injured.

July 10: One man was injured in a Russian attack on the Vasylivka district.

July 13: One person was injured due to Russian shelling in the Vasylivka district.

Dnipropetrovsk Region

July 7: Russians attacked the Nikopol district ten times with kamikaze drones and heavy artillery. In the evening, four people were injured due to shelling in Nikopol.

July 8: The Russian army launched massive missile strikes on Kryvyi Rih and Dnipro. In Kryvyi Rih, a missile hit an enterprise and residential area, killing ten people and injuring 47. In Dnipro, one person was killed and 19 were injured. The Nikopol district was also shelled, injuring a 65-year-old man.

July 10: Russians repeatedly struck the Nikopol district, killing one person and injuring five others.

July 11: Two people were injured in a kamikaze drone attack on the Pokrovs community of the Nikopol district.

July 13: Four people were injured due to shelling in the Nikopol district. Overall, the Russians shelled the Nikopol district daily throughout the week.

Kherson and the oblast

July 7: The Russians shelled 15 settlements, including a missile strike on the Kherson district.

July 8: 19 settlements were shelled, damaging medical and educational institutions, two apartment buildings, and 27 private houses. The morning of July 9: Russians dropped explosives from a drone on two people in Kherson. In Kizomys, a man died due to shelling, and a woman was injured in Stanislav. Overall, 12 settlements were shelled that day. July 10: Russian troops shelled 21 settlements. In Inhulets, a man was killed, and there were injuries in Shyroka Balka. July 11: Russians dropped explosives from a drone on rescuers extinguishing a fire in the Bilozerka community. An FPV drone attack on a humanitarian aid distribution point in Stanislav injured two female volunteers. Shelling in Osokorivka and Kherson injured a rescuer and three civilians. Overall, 19 settlements were attacked that day. July 12: Russians shelled 14 settlements. There were injuries in Beryslav, Stanislav, and Antonivka. July 13: Russian troops shelled Tokarivka with artillery, resulting in one killed and one injured. There were also casualties and injuries in Pryozerne and Kindiika.

Odesa oblast

On the morning of June 30, 2024, Russian troops attacked Odesa region with a ballistic missile, July 9: The Russians attacked the region with a ballistic missile, likely an "Iskander-M."

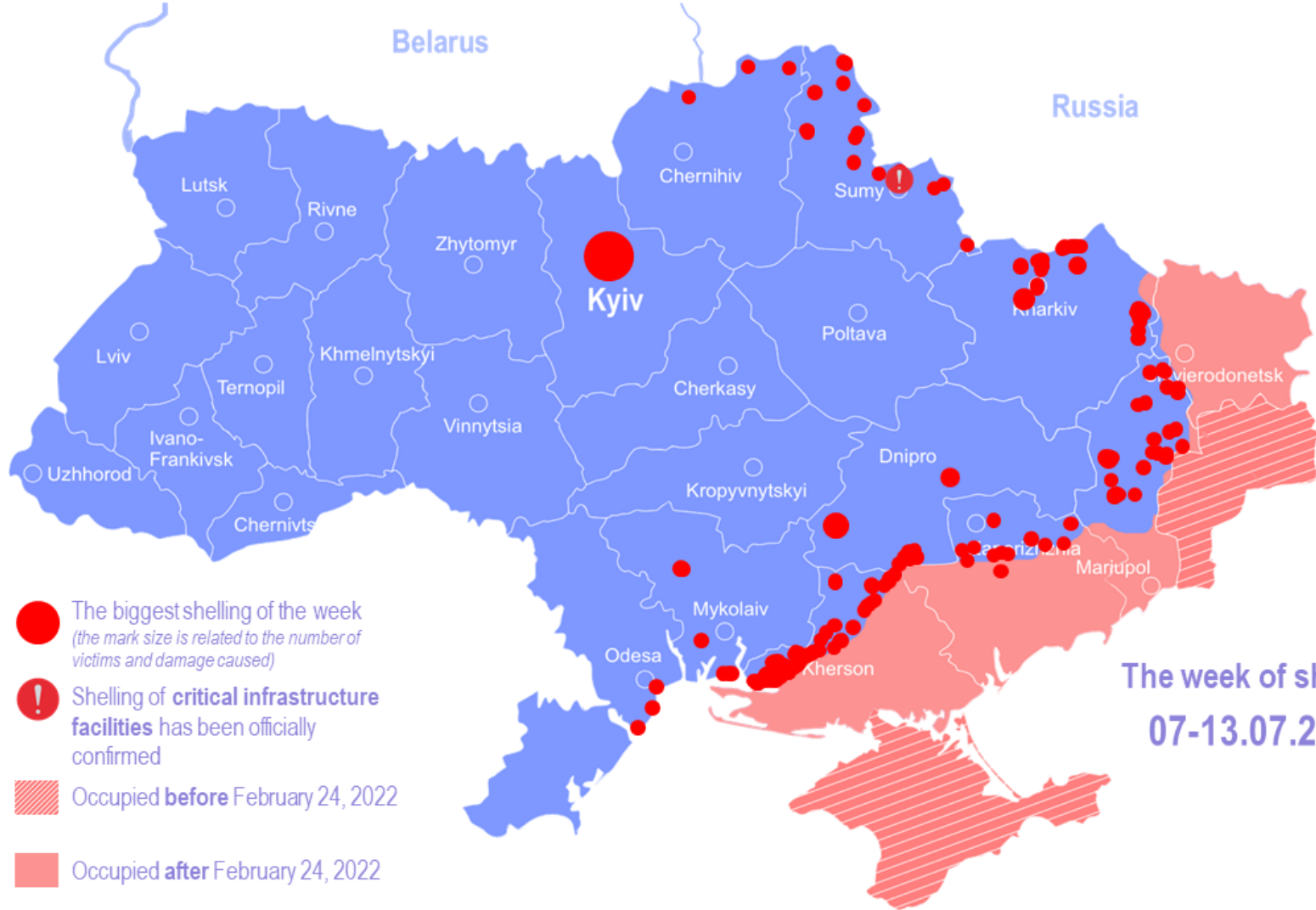
Night of July 10: The Russian army launched a missile strike on the port infrastructure of the region, resulting in two deaths and one injury.

July 13: The region was attacked again with a ballistic missile, likely an "Iskander-M." an Iskander-M.

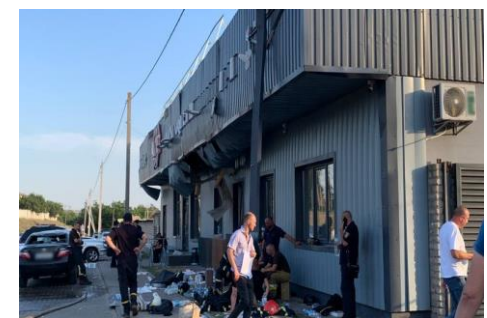
Kyiv oblast

Morning of July 8: The Russians launched a massive and combined missile attack on Kyiv, resulting in 33 deaths, including five children, and injuring 121 people. Hospital Attack: A Kh-101 missile struck the "Ohmatdyt" children's hospital, destroying two floors and damaging several other buildings. Two people were killed. Shevchenkivskiy District: A missile hit a multi-story residential building, destroying one entrance completely. Seven people, including three children, were killed, and 18 were injured. Industrial Site: An industrial facility was also hit, killing two people and injuring three others. Solomianskyi District: The "Domino" business center was damaged, resulting in seven deaths and nine injuries. Holosiivskiy District: A five-story building partially collapsed, injuring 22 people. An educational institution nearby was also damaged. Dniprovskiy District: A four-story medical facility was partially destroyed, with nine people killed and five injured. Darnytskyi District: A private house was damaged, injuring one woman. Additional damage was reported in the Desnianskyi and Sviatoshynskiy districts.

07.07	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ The National Resistance Centre (NRC) reports that Russians in the temporarily occupied territories of the Zaporizhzhia region have developed a procedure for obtaining the so-called "rights to use Ukrainian subsoil." It is about "legalizing" the exploitation of Ukrainian resources in the temporarily occupied territories of Ukraine. ➤ The NRC reports on the denial of medical care to pregnant women in the occupation without a Russian passport. If a woman does not have a Russian passport, she does not have access to medical care and social benefits.
08.07	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ The number of civilian prisoners illegally held in various places of detention may reach 20,000, according to Olha Skrypnyk, head of the Crimean Human Rights Group. ➤ During a press conference at the Media Centre Ukraine, the President of the National Olympic Committee, Vadym Huttsait, said that Ukraine had lost more than 500 sports facilities, many of which were located in the temporarily occupied territories.
09.07	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Ukraine has managed to return 736 children illegally taken to Russia since the start of the full-scale invasion, according to Dmytro Lubinets, the Ukrainian Parliament Commissioner for Human Rights. Currently, Qatar is the mediating state in the return of Ukrainian children illegally deported by Russia. The ombudsman also announced that the Ukrainian side had already been preparing for the return of the next groups of children. ➤ More than 30 countries are ready to accept children from Okhmatdyt for treatment, Health Minister Viktor Liashko has said. All the Baltic countries, EU countries, the United States of America, and others have made such offers. The Minister of Health also noted that the sick children have been distributed to other hospitals in the capital. If necessary, they will be sent abroad.
10.07	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ It has become known about another execution of captured Ukrainian soldiers by the Russian forces. According to the investigation, the crime was committed in June 2024 near Rabotyne, a village in the Zaporizhzhia region. Criminal proceedings have been initiated for violation of the laws and customs of war, combined with premeditated murder. Some analysts suggest that the perpetrators may be members of the 70th Motorized Rifle Regiment (military unit 71718), who were involved in the assaults on Ukrainian positions in Robotyne. ➤ A foreign cargo ship and its captain were detained in the waters of the Odesa region. According to the SBU, the ship was flying the flag of a country from Central Africa, and its crew was carrying out an order from Russia to export Ukrainian grain from the temporarily occupied Crimea. During 2023-2024, the vessel repeatedly docked at the seaport of Sevastopol and then transported the cargo to the Middle East for sale in favor of Russia.
11.07	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Ukrainian Navy spokesperson Dmytro Pletenchuk said that there could be 400 mines in the Black Sea, however, this is an approximate number, as it is difficult to calculate the exact amount due to the explosion of the Kakhovka hydroelectric power station and the ingress of explosive devices.

11.07	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ In June, at least 146 civilians were killed in hostilities in Ukraine. Another 672 people were injured. The number of child casualties in June is the highest in 2024, with 8 children killed and 57 injured. In total, the OSCE Special Monitoring Mission has recorded 33,878 civilian casualties since the beginning of Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine. In particular, 11,284 people have been killed. ➤ 27% of environmental crimes committed by the Russian Federation in Ukraine are in the Kharkiv region. Ruslan Strilets, the Minister of Environmental Protection and Natural Resources, said. As of 10 July 1436 cases of Russian ecocide in Ukraine were registered in the Kharkiv region out of all 5298 cases in Ukraine. The amount of environmental damage in the region is UAH 469 billion. The amount of environmental damage caused by the attack on the Episentr construction supermarket alone is UAH 860 million. With this explosion, Russia released a large amount of hazardous substances into the air, as this supermarket sold paints, varnishes, solvents, etc.
12.07	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ The UN General Assembly adopted a resolution on the safety and security of Ukrainian nuclear facilities, including the Zaporizhzhia NPP. The resolution emphasizes the need for demilitarization and de-occupation of the Zaporizhzhia NPP in connection with Russia's failure to comply with the resolutions of the IAEA's governing bodies. ➤ In the Chuhuiv district of the Kharkiv region, six people exploded on an enemy tripwire during an evacuation, three of the victims suffered acute stress reactions, and the other three sustained blast injuries. Since 24 February 2022, more than a thousand people have been injured by explosive devices in Ukraine, 297 of whom have died. ➤ The toxicology building of the Okhmatdyt Children's Hospital in Kyiv, which was hit by a Russian missile on 8 July, cannot be restored. A new one will be built in its place. This was stated by the Minister of Health of Ukraine Viktor Liashko.
13.07	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ The Russian military has been sending so-called "militiamen" to the temporarily occupied territories of the Zaporizhzhia and Kherson regions to patrol the settlements. At the same time, their main task is not to fight against crime but to ensure that no one takes pictures of the location of the Russian armed forces in the occupied territories. This is what the National Resistance Centre writes about. The NRC emphasizes that the number of local "militiamen" is small, so the Russians have formed groups of people from the territories occupied in 2014. For this, they receive a salary and a social package. ➤ Russian non-governmental organizations operating in social media are extorting official documents and personal information from relatives of Ukrainian prisoners of war and missing defenders for further manipulation and pressure. This was stated by the Coordination Headquarters for the Treatment of Prisoners of War.
